## Research Interests

### Parenting in Cultural and Religious Contexts

I'm interested in studying parenting from an ethnographic perspective in its own context. Specifically, I'd like to explore how culture and religion shape parenting practices, and what parents draw from when they formulate their parenting identity. I'm particularly interested in Egyptian and Arab speaking populations.

### Parental Resilience and Parent Education

I'd like to study parents as individuals, not merely as a channel for children's development. Resilience has traditionally been studied in contexts of trauma, however, it emerges with the inevitable stressors that parents face. I'm interested in studying the factors that promote parental resilience and how they can be incorporated in designing parent education programs.

## Research Projects

### "An Exploration of Parenting in Egypt"

This research project is an exploration of parenting in Egypt. It was in the form of semi-structured interviews with 20 parents living in Egypt, spanning different topics relating to child rearing and parenting practices, and parent-child relationships. By exploring parental ethno-theories through qualitative methodology, we are developing information useful for later developing culture-specific measures and future directions of study. Data was collected in Summer 2019. Transcription and analysis are ongoing.
